The Columbia City Common Council met in regular session with all members present, Mayor Daniel presiding.

**MINUTES** Motion was made by Jennifer Romano to approve an overview of the August 13, 2019 meeting minutes, Nicole Penrod seconded the motion, all voted aye.

**DEPARTMENT REPORTS** **Mark Green** – Aquatics Center and Splash Pad now closed, Veteran’s Marathon is November 9, JPR Engineers still working on plans for high school property. **Scott Leatherman** – Officer Porter graduated from the Academy. **Shawn Lickey** – temporary power for McDonald’s, started running conduit for Van Buren Flats, outages due to storm. **Mike Shoda** – Update on Well 8 repairs. **Mike Cook** – quote on inspections for headworks pumps, HVAC unit installed in headworks building, update on biomonitoring. **Kelly Cearbaugh** – new employee Dustin Stewart, pipe inspections at new Cambridge Crossing area, update on Community Crossings paving project, working on tree trimming.

**YOUTH COUNCIL** Eden Oddou was present to discuss the activities of the Youth Council.

**CITY HALL GARAGE DOORS** Rosie Coyle reported the motor was burnt up in one of the garage doors in the police bay area. She advised they had gotten a quote for new doors and opener for next year, which was \$7,800.00. She questioned if Council would approve moving forward with replacing the doors this year and taking the money out of the Rainy Day Fund.

Nicole Penrod questioned how much was in the Rainy Day Fund currently. Rosie Coyle advised there was about \$100,000.00 appropriated but it was not earmarked for anything.

Council members were in agreement to move forward.

Jennifer Romano questioned if there was any merit in checking around on pricing. Rosie Coyle did not believe so. She mentioned the gentleman who was in to work on the door advised the replacement price was a really good price.

**DECEMBER MEETING CHANGE** Mayor Daniel noted the 2<sup>nd</sup> meeting in December was scheduled for December 24 and proposed moving the meeting to December 30.

**WEST ELLSWORTH – SPEED SIGN** Walt Crowder questioned how the evaluation of West Ellsworth speed had been going. He advised Kelly Cearbaugh posted a speed limit sign and they also have the speed sign posted to get a reading for a couple weeks to get a sense of speeds and peak times.

Mayor Daniel advised he also sent a letter to NOVAE regarding their delivery trucks coming down Ellsworth and to redirect them to Van Buren Street.
